Elaine Freckleton,

73, child psychiatrist, physician in Decatur

Being a female medical student at a time when women were not treated equally didn't stop Elaine Lucille Donnellan Freckleton from becoming a doctor and, later, a child psychiatrist in Decatur.

Dr. Freckleton, whose patients called her "Dr. D," graduated first in her class at McGill University Medical School in Montreal in 1949, said her son, Michael Donnellan of Atlanta.

"When she began her studies, women were not allowed in the front door of many of the buildings," he said. "She always said she didn't care. She would have been willing to climb in the window."

The memorial service for Dr. Freckleton, 73, was Monday. She died of heart failure at her Decatur home Aug. 19. The body was donated to Emory University School of Medicine.

The doctor began practicing medicine in DeKalb County in 1965 as Elaine K. Donnellan, M.D., her married name.

She later married Dr. F. Robert Freckleton, an officer in the U.S. Public Health Service, who died in 1978. She became a psychiatrist in the late 1960s and served her residency at Emory University Hospital.

Dr. Freckleton was a member of Central Congregational Church of the United Church of Christ.



Elaine Freckleton was an early female medical student.

Born in Hagerstown, Md., she was the brightest girl in her high school, said her son.

She originally wanted to be a nurse, but her mother encouraged her to set her sights higher.

Her first job in the metro area was with the DeKalb County Health Department. She also worked at the Georgia Retardation Center, later called Brook Run, and the Gracewood State School and Hospital in Augusta.

Dot Barnes of Lawrenceville typed Dr. Freckleton's consultation notes at Brook Run and was a frequent traveling companion.

"She was such a loving, genuine compassionate doctor," she said. "Her patients loved her dearly. She was a pro in the retardation field. She was a gift to all."

She had two main strengths as a diagnostician, her son said.

"She really cared about the patient, would put her hands on you, listen to you and like you. And, she could just figure stuff out faster than someone else. She could diagnose when other doctors were stumped. And she did it over and over again."

Surviving in addition to her son is a brother, Guy Kidwell of Cleveland.



Remembering Bill

Friends of slain soldier take part in sign ceremony

Sixty years evaporated Wednesday in Hagerstown's North End.

World War II veterans Wayne Kiser, 81, and Asher Edelman, 82, stood at the intersection of Forest Drive and Park Lane and recalled their war exploits.

They remembered fellow Hagerstown native Bill Altenderfer Jr., a friend killed in action.

Above them was a small black sign, newly affixed atop the green Park Lane road sign, across the street from where Altenderfer grew up.

The Washington County Joint Veterans Council put up the sign Wednesday as part of an ongoing project that started about 20 years ago, council member Pete Callas said.

Council members also put up a sign at 3rd Street and Pope Avenue on the outskirts of Hagerstown to remember Cpl. Vernon Mulligan, who was killed in the Korean War.

Finally, council members gave the

Clear Spring American Legion Post a plaque in memory of Cpl. John W. Wagner, a Medal of Honor winner for his service during the Civil War Battle of Vicksburg.

The Altenderfer sign was the first one dedicated with people who served with the person being remembered, Callas said.

Kiser, who now lives near Williamsport, said he, Edelman and Altenderfer were among the Hagerstonians sent overseas in 1944.

Kiser said he and Edelman were machine gunners in the U.S. Army's 101st Infantry Regiment in the 26th Infantry Division.

"Do you remember going out and probing for mines on the beach?" Kiser asked.

"No, I never got that job," said Edelman, who lives in Waynesboro,

Kiser said three things happened within a few days in November 1944: Edelman was injured, Hagerstonian Robert Wallace was captured and Altenderfer was killed.

The story on Altenderfer's death,

as it reached Kiser, was that he had captured someone and had a white surrender flag when he was killed.

"He was a rifleman and he was kind of a daring soul," Kiser said. "He was a great guy to go to town with when we were back here in the states."

"He was always happy ...," Edelman said. "He always wanted to get into things."

A key detail that got foggy over time is Altenderfer's given name.

A newspaper account of his acceptance into the service calls him William. An account of his death calls him Willis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Willis L. Altenderfer.

Kiser thought he was William, but conceded that Willis might be right.

Either way, the sign erected Wednesday had the wrong first initial and year of death. It reads "PFC M.L. Altenderfer Jr., US Army, 1924-1945."

Anthony Pruchniewski of the Joint Veterans Council said the Army provided incorrect information and the sign will be replaced.

"The GIs referred to it as the Ruptured Duck," he said.

Middlekauff was born and raised in Hagerstown and moved to Morgan County in 1950.

He said he was in the 26th Infantry Division in 1944 and was with Gen. George Patton's 3rd Army in Normandy. He fought in the Battle of the Bulge in Bastogne, Belgium.

"We relieved the besieged town of Bastogne that was circled by the Germans on Dec. 26 in 1944," Middlekauff said.

He said the first war monument is an important part of the community, and the committee did not want the new memorial to overshadow it.

Both monuments "complement each other and add to the beauty of the town," he said.

Hawvermale, said World War I veterans in 1943 erected a plywood monument with 800 hand-lettered names, representing the number of World War II Morgan County citizens that served at that time.

The 16-by-8-foot-high monument stood where the Magistrate Court building is now, on the corner of Fairfax and Mercer streets.

"Time took its toll," he said.

When the committee began gathering the names of those who served, it was made more difficult by the fact that U.S. military service records stored in St. Louis were lost in a fire in the 1960s, he said.

Hawvermale said Middlekauff got the 800 names from a photograph of the plywood monument by using a magnifying glass and then published them in the local newspaper to find other county citizens who served during World War II.

Veterans and families from as far away as California, Nevada and Texas were contacted, Middlekauff said.

"As far as we know, we got everybody on the monument that served," he said.

"This was an honor to build," said Don McClure, owner of Gordon's Memorials in McConnellsburg, Pa., who erected the memorial.

He said it took more than two years to make the monument, which weighs about 30 tons. He said it was sculpted by a company in Barre, Vt., from granite found there.

Soon after the ceremony was over, many people began getting rubbings of their relatives' names that are cast in raised bronze letters on the memorial.

Sisters Carol Potter Miller and Diane Potter Fox got a rubbing of their father's name. Melvin I. Potter. He served in Burma and was one of Merrill's Marauders, they said

WWII memorial unveiled in Morgan Co.

BERKELEY SPRINGS, W.VA.

Morgan County World War II veterans were honored with the unveiling of a new memorial on Sunday during a Veterans Day ceremony attended by more than 1,000 people.

Robert Hawvermale, chairman of the Morgan County, W.Va., World War II Veterans Association, spoke with emotion during the ceremony.

All 1,147 Morgan County citizens who served from Dec. 7, 1941, to Dec. 31, 1946, are listed on the memorial, he said.

The new monument is across from the Magistrate Court building on the Fairfax Street Green.

Hawvermale is a veteran of the Korean War, and he and other American Legion members talked about honoring the World War II veterans. "We relieved the besieged town of Bastogne that was circled by the Germans on Dec. 26, 1944."

D-Pocahontas.

"Sen. Helmick came and sat down with the committee, and we asked for his assistance," Hawvermale said. "He was a lifesaver on this."

Helmick, Del. Daryl Cowles, R-Morgan, and former Del. Charles Trump attended the ceremony, along with other town and county officials.

"We deemed it to be important and appropriate," Helmick said before the ceremony.

The 16-foot monument is similar to the World War I memorial on the Fairfax Street Green, except for the World War II service symbol of the earle Middlekauff's voice also broke with emotion during the ceremony.

He explained that the small gold pin depicting an eagle inside a wreath was awarded to the American military forces that were honorably discharged after World War II.

"The GIs referred to it as the Ruptured Duck," he said.

Middlekauff was born and raised in Hagerstown and moved to Morgan County in 1950.

He said he was in the 26th Infantry Division in 1944 and was with Gen. George Patton's 3rd Army in Normandy. He fought in the Battle of the Bulge in Bastogne, Belgium.

"We relieved the besieged town of Bastogne that was circled by the Germans on Dec. 26 in 1944," Middlekauff said.

He was awarded the Purple Heart and the Silver Star.

Middlekauff said the Jorgigions idea was to add the World War II veterans to the existing monument that was

He said the first war monument is an important part of the community, and the committee did not want the new memorial to overshadow it.

Both monuments "complement each other and add to the beauty of the town," he said

Hawvermale said World War I veterans in 1943 erected a plywood monument with 800 hand-lettered names, representing the number of World War II Morgan County citizens that served at that time.

The 16-by-8-foot-high monument stood where the Magistrate Court building is now, on the corner of Fairfax and Mercer streets.

"Time took its toll," he said.

When the committee began gathering the names of those who served, it was made more difficult by the fact that U.S. military service records stored in St. Louis were lost in a fire in the 1960s, he said.

Hawvermale said Middlekauff got the 800 names from a photograph of the plywood monument by using a magnifying glass and then published them in the local newspaper to find other county citizens who served during World War II.

Veterans and families from as far away as California, Nevada and Texas were contacted, Middlekauff said.

"As far as we know, we got everybody on the monument that served," he said.

"This was an honor to build," said Don McClure, owner of Gordon's Memorials in McConnellsburg, Pa., who erected the memorial.

He said it took more than two years to make the monument, which weighs about 30 tons. He said it was sculpted by a company in Barre, Vt., from granite found there.

Soon after the ceremony was over, many people began getting rubbings of their relatives' names that are cast in raised bronze letters on the memorial.

Sisters Carol Potter Miller and Diane Potter Fox got a rubbing of their father's name, Melvin I. Potter. He served in Burma and was one of Merrill's Marauders, they said.
