Her mother, Jean Beckward of Cumberland, is director of the show. Tamu Beckward is a former dance movement and gymnastics instructor at the University of California at Berkeley and Emory University in Atlanta. She had supporting acting roles in the movies "Beverly Hills Cop III" and "Angels in the Outfield."
