The present is the fourth week that the Circuit Court for this County has been in session, and the probability is, that it will continue at least another week. An unusually large amount of criminal business has engaged the attention of the Court, and there is still a good deal of it on the docket. One person has been convicted of murder in the first degree, and six of larceny and other Penitentiary offences, whilst there are yet several others in prison awaiting their trials, one of whom (Anderson) has been indicted for murder.
